Philosophy and objectives

The Barcelona Edita Forum is an international annual meeting of publishers and editors that aims to be a regular platform to debate the main challenges of the sector, foster the exchange of ideas and relations between professionals from the publishing field, and consolidate the role of Barcelona as the international capital of books and publishing following its designation as UNESCO City of Literature. It also endeavours to bring together around the debating table the university students who in the immediate future will also play a key role in the development of the publishing sector.

The Barcelona Edita Forum is promoted by the Catalan Guild of Publishers and Editors and Pompeu Fabra University, sponsored by Barcelona City Council in collaboration with CEDRO, the Spanish Federation of Publishers' and Editors' Guilds, the Department of Culture of the Government of Catalonia and the Spanish Ministry of Culture.

Key aspects of the project

Forum of Latin American scope from Barcelona



Historically, Barcelona has been the publishing capital of the Spanish and Catalan languages and remains so in terms of turnover. This central role has greatly influenced both the cultural power of the city, a reference for Latin American writers and professionals, and its economic activity, with a wide-ranging network of publishing houses based in Barcelona and a presence throughout the Spanish-speaking world.

This strong publishing industry ranges from large groups that lead the market on both sides of the Atlantic to many small- and medium-sized companies whose international activity is a fundamental part of their business.

Barcelona is also the historical capital of publishing in Catalan, from the first publications in the 15th century to the major expansion of the Catalan Renaissance in the 19th century and its important influence today. An especially important moment for publishing in Catalan was Catalan culture's presence at the Frankfurt Book Fair 2007 as guest of honour.

This universal aspiration of Barcelona as the publishing capital of the Latin American and international world makes it the central pillar for reflection and debate. The ideal setting to annually bring together most of the professionals involved in the value chain of the book industry and to analyse and share challenges from a global perspective with a major focus on Latin America.



Revolution in the sector

We can say that in the last five centuries, the book sector has undergone continuous transformation. However, at present it is experiencing a real revolution. Technological advances, especially in the digital field, new forms of reading or changes in the field of distribution are creating both exciting expectations and uncertainties.

All over the world, big groups and small and innovative publishing companies are developing imaginative strategies to challenge these uncertainties and consolidate the role of books and reading – as well as the cultural industry encompassing them – in the 21st century panorama. The Barcelona Edita Forum will be the ideal framework for professionals to share all these experiences.



Cities and multiculturalism

The incorporation of Barcelona in the UNESCO Literature Cities Network highlights the decisive role of cities within the current development of culture, an issue that this international organisation always emphasises in its reports.

The Barcelona Edita Forum will debate this issue by analysing the contacts, partnerships and initiatives that our city can establish with other cities in the network.

Similarly, the Forum will explore issues such as the possibility of sharing policies to promote reading and citizen participation in cultural matters between like-minded cities.

Barcelona, along with being the publishing capital of Spanish, also of course holds this position for the Catalan language. The UNESCO network will enable the Catalan book sector to establish links with similar publishing sectors working for comparable markets.

The organisers

The Catalan Guild of Publishers and Editors

Institution that embodies five centuries of Barcelona's publishing tradition. It embraces more than 200 publishing companies with 48.3% of the total Spanish publishing business volume. It is particularly representative in fields such as literature, with a market share of 80%, books for children and young people (65%), educational books (77%), dictionaries, encyclopaedias or comics (75%).

Around 25 publishing houses in the guild have over 120 subsidiaries or branches in approximately thirty countries in Europe, Asia and America.

Committed to the improvement and development of the sector, the Guild currently supports a wide range of professional and cultural activities.

Pompeu Fabra University

Pompeu Fabra University's prestigious Master in Publishing and Editing is now in its 20th year. This master is one of the major international references for training in the profession and has become one of Barcelona's hallmarks in the field of publishing leadership. In this period, it has trained several generations of professionals who are today responsible for publishing projects in Catalonia, Spain, Latin America and Europe. Notable among the institutions and companies that regularly contribute to it are the Catalan Guild of Publishers and Editors, the Grupo Planeta, the Penguin Random House group, Anagrama, CEDRO, La Central, RBA, Google, Cayfosa or the Guadalajara International Book Fair (Mexico), the most important fair of the sector in Spanish, and the Frankfurt Book Fair, the most important in the world.
